Pipe Organ Progress

We are anxiously awaiting the installation of our new pipe organ, which will be the culmination of a journey that began in 2018 when the Pipe Organ Committee set out to determine whether we should repair, restore, or replace the old pipe organ. Over the next three years, thousands of hours were spent researching the websites of leading pipe organ builders and their professional associations. The team made site visits to other churches and had representatives from six pipe organ companies inspect the old pipe organ and submit proposals.

In August 2021 an all-church conference voted to approve the project followed by the signing of the contract with Reynolds and Associates Pipe Organ Builders and Conservators of Marion, Ind. The value of the Reynolds option (\$565,562) was mid-range among all the options (\$400,000-\$1,3000,000).

The new pipe organ will be comprised of a new 3-manual (or keyboard) console with state-of-the-art features that are expected by today's organists. There will be 33 ranks of pipes (2,013 pipes in all), some of which will be exposed to the sanctuary on either side of the cross, as pictured below.



The original completion date of Easter of 2023 was not met, and there is no single person or happening responsible for the delay. While the pandemic was the major factor behind most of the challenges faced, the war in Ukraine and supply chain issues were also contributing factors. In addition, the strict lock-down in Europe caused some suppliers to go out of business, and key people in the Reynolds shop faced significant health challenges.

All the wind chests, air pressure regulators, the console, the blower motor and many other components


are completed and ready to go, and Reynolds has been working in the pipe chambers preparing them for installation when all the pipes are available. Because of the aluminum shortage, we have not received 48 of the largest pipes (16-feet tall and larger), which have to be installed first.

The Reynolds' pipe voicing specialist is now in the process of "voicing and tuning" all of the available 1,900 pipes. This tedious and time-consuming

process requires working with each pipe individually, making sure it sounds good by itself and in combination with all the other pipes of that rank. With 33 ranks of pipes, this process is the main task that is yet to be completed.

Voicing organ pipes is both a science and an art that consists of:





- Manual adjustments to the size of the bottom orifice to regulate the volume of air entering that pipe, which determines loudness
- Manual adjustments that trim and shape the speaking mouth of each pipe to create the desired tonal color and quality, and
- Manual adjustments to the length of the pipe to achieve the precise pitch. It is during the voicing process that the actual soul of the pipe organ is being born.

We now hope the new pipe organ will be playable at some point in October or November with a full completion date early in 2024.

Ultimately, there will be a formal dedication with a recital, blessing, and consecration of the new pipe organ for God's service.

The Altar Guild is a lay ministry that serves in preparing God's house for worship and assists with holiday preparations, Communion, weddings and funerals. We are looking for those






Across the communities we serve, more than 2,400 donors are needed every day to maintain a safe and adequate blood supply for patients.

Disciple Fast Track Bible Study



Disciple Fast Track Bible Study is an adaptation of the original, bestselling Disciple Bible Study: Becoming Disciples through Bible Study, but Fast Track is suited for busy people who want to fit a shorter, but still comprehensive Bible study into their schedules.

Classes meet for a total of 24 weeks, studying the Old and New Testaments for 12 sessions each. Daily study is manageable, with only 3-5 chapters of the Bible to read each day. Weekly group sessions last 75 minutes and

there will be a small group activity in most sessions.

The first 12-week session starts on Tuesday, October 10 at 6:30PM with Richard Bellaver leading the study of the New Testament. The cost of the study manual is \$17 and childcare is available!


