There's room here at Noblesville First and there's always room in the kingdom of God.



Easter Egg Hunt

Come for a morning of games, crafts, inflatables, and LOTS of candy! In the event of rain, we'll move inside to Celebration Hall (Doors 2&7).



Palm Sunday worship

Palm Sunday marks Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the start of Holy Week. Don't miss the children's palm-waving hosanna parade through the sanctuary and their performance with the chancel choir on March 24 at both 9:00 and 10:30 worship in the sanctuary (Door 1).



Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday marks the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples. "Maundy" comes from the Latin word mandatum, or commandment, reflecting Jesus' words, "I give you a new commandment." Our pastors will lead us in an interactive Maundy Thursday communion service on March 28 at 7PM in Celebration Hall (Doors 2&7). We will celebrate the disciples Last Supper with Jesus by sharing communion together at tables just as Jesus' disciples did some 2,000 years ago.



Good Friday vigil & worship

Good Friday marks the crucifixion of Jesus and his death on Calvary. The church will mark this day with a **Good Friday Prayer Vigil** on March 29 from 7AM to 6:30PM in the chapel (Door 1). Then come for **Good Friday Worship** at 7PM in the sanctuary

Safety & security at Noblesville First

Safety and security are crucial for the church, while also maintaining a welcoming environment. Safety precautions include installation of additional security cameras to monitor activity in and around our church grounds, providing staff with radios to communicate suspicious activity, adding emergency alerts for preschool and church staff, and screening visitors at the door.

During the day, meeting leaders should ask participants to sign in at each meeting. Ask someone to watch doors to ensure unknown visitors are not entering without an escort. Visitors should be escorted to the office. In the evening, do not allow unexpected visitors inside without an escort. Check all doors and turn out lights before leaving and be mindful of security.
